Following points were discussed and decisions were taken in the meeting:

To confirm the minutes of previous academic council meeting held Point No. 1] on 05/01/2019.

Minutes of previous academic council meeting held on 05/01/2019 Decision were confirmed.

To decide total number of credits of B.Tech. Programme & year-wise Point No. 21 distribution of credits for the structure to be revised w.e.f. AY: 2020-2021.

Prof. Ingale, Dean Academics presented proposed B.Tech Discussion structure of total credits 161.

> In this structure one semester internship or project is proposed. (7<sup>th</sup> semester).

> Dr. Varsha Patil suggested to increase number of credits upto 165 to accommodate more core courses. Madam also suggested to offer more options under elective courses.

> Dr. Varsha Patil suggested to keep option of internship and 3 months project at 7<sup>th</sup> semester.

Dr. Sachin Lodha suggested to frame guidelines for internship on following points.

Projects/ technical work expected during internships

Monitoring frequency and procedure

Evaluation rubrics

Dr. sachin Lodha also suggested to consider internship at eighth semester instead of seventh.

- Prof. Mucharikar expressed that as most of the companies visit for placement in seventh semester, seventh semester internship will be more beneficial for placement than eighth semester internship.
- Dr. Datta Kuvalekar suggested that, internship companies may be requested to give 10 days leave to students to participate in campus placement activity.

Decision

- It is decided to allot maximum 165 credits for four years for B.Tech. course w.e.f. A.Y. 2020-21. It is also decided to allow flexibility of total credits to departments in the range of 163 to 165.
- It is decided to incorporate six months internship or six months project or 3 months internship and 3 months project at seventh semester, in B.Tech. program.

To review the status of T.Y. B.Tech students' Summer Internships for AY: 2018-19.

Discussion

- Prof Ingale presented statistics of T.Y. B.Tech, Summer Internships. 92% students are selected by industries for internships. 88 students are getting stipend during internship. Few students have got opportunity of Internships at abroad
- Dr. Datta Kuvalekar suggested to evaluate internship periodically and also at the end.
- Dr. Sachin Lodha said that through student internships, faculty can build good relationship with industry which may result into institute-industry collaborations.

Decision

All mebers appreciated the efforts taken by placement office and faculty members for providing internships to more than 90% students.
